SCOPE OF WORK

RAND designed and administered the following work items:

 Energy-efficient, high-velocity HVAC system with Energy Recovery Ventilation to fit within limited floor space

- Unifying electrical plan supporting 4,500 watts of LED lighting and HVAC system using existing commercial electrical panels
- Custom storefront including engraved limestone sign band, granite stone bulkhead cladding, tempered glass, and aged brass metalwork door and framing caps
- Custom millwork including plinths, sliding panels of verre eglomise, reclaimed sawn parquet flooring, and latex ceiling
- Custom lighting design

RAND obtained work permits from the New York City Department of Buildings and Landmarks Preservation Commission.
