Roof Replacement & Exterior Restoration Program









Constructed of brick with brownstone trim, 153 Lincoln Place's most distinctive features include a terra cotta-shingled faceted turret; rusticated stone base; delicate pediment dormer; and several decorative brick, stone, and terra cotta friezes.

PROPERTY

Built as a private residence in 1887 and converted into a 10-unit condominium in 2009, **153 Lincoln Place** is a four-story Romanesque Revival townhouse located in the Park Slope Historic District of Brooklyn.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Complete roof replacement and exterior restoration program initiated based on findings from a RAND leakage evaluation.

SCOPE OF WORK

RAND designed and administered the following work items:

Complete removal of existing roofing system

- New insulated cold fluid-applied reinforced roofing system and slate roofing system installation
- Replacement of defective copper gutting sections, copper leader sections, and clay coping segments
- Removal of leaking two-wythe thick brick stub parapet wall and construction of a new codecompliant stub parapet
- Defective brickwork replaced, and eroded brickwork mortar joints cut out and repointed
- Resetting of terra cotta shingles
- Removal and replacement of defective wood and metal window trim

RAND's Code & Zoning Compliance Team obtained all necessary work permits from the New York City Department of Buildings and the Landmarks Preservation Commission.
